

MINUTES OF THE JULY 6, 2010 CITY COMMISSION MEETING

The regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Holton met at 7:00 P.M. in City Hall on Tuesday evening, July 6, 2010. Commissioners Tim Morris, Janet Zwonitzer and Bob Dieckmann were present. JJ Cashier was absent. Mayor Rich Mulroy called the meeting to order.

Minutes of the June 21, 2010 meeting were approved as written.

NEW CITY MANAGER: Bret Bauer, new city manager, was introduced. Bauer took over as city manager effective July 1, 2010.

APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE: Claims against the City of Holton between June 21, 2010 and July 6, 2010, were presented to the Commission for their approval. After careful consideration, said claims were approved and given the title Appropriation Ordinance #2014. Janet Zwonitzer moved and Tim Morris seconded the motion for their approval. Vote thereon: all, yes.

PROCLAMATION - 20TH ANNIVERSARY OF ADA: Mayor Rich Mulroy read a proclamation showing the city's support in this 20th year of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Tim Morris moved the pass the proclamation. Bob Dieckmann seconded the motion. Vote thereon: all, yes.

APPOINTMENT TO HOLTON COMMUNITY HOSPITAL BOARD: The Holton City Commission appoints the Class B Director position on the Rural Health Resources Board of Directors. This appointment has a three year term, and that position is up for appointment this year. The candidates for the position were Irvin Sanderson, Brian Lull, and Jim Ketron. Tim Morris moved to appoint Jim Ketron. Janet Zwonitzer seconded the motion. Vote thereon: Morris, Zwonitzer, Mulroy, yes; Dieckmann, abstain. Motion carried.

In other business:

McKee informed the commission that the Ohio Street project was completed and the street was open. There are still some driveway entrances to pour and final dressing at curbs, but it is essentially complete.

McKee also informed the commission that the Linscott Park Playground Project was complete. Over 100 volunteers were at the site each day, with over 5000 volunteer hours put in the project. The park is now open.

Bret Bauer, City Manager, informed the commission that he had spent his first 2 days touring city offices and getting introduced to staff.
